Indonesia's Independence Day, celebrated every August 17th, is more than just a national holiday it's a symbol of pride, resilience, and unity. Beyond the official ceremonies and vibrant celebrations, here are some lesser-known yet fascinating facts about this historic day:

1. The Proclamation Was Typed on a Borrowed Typewriter

The text of Indonesia's Proclamation of Independence was typed by Sayuti Melik using a typewriter borrowed from a Japanese military office. The typewriter was actually of Dutch origin.

2. The First Flag Was Handmade

The original red-and-white flag (Sang Saka Merah Putih) was sewn by Fatmawati, the wife of President Soekarno. Made from cotton fabric, this flag was first hoisted on August 17, 1945, and is now preserved at the National Monument in Jakarta.

3. The Ceremony Was Modest but Historic

The proclamation of independence took place at Soekarno's house on Jalan Pegangsaan Timur No. 56, Jakarta. The ceremony was simple, attended only by a small group of people, but it changed the course of history.

4. Official Recognition Came Years Later

Although independence was declared in 1945, the Netherlands did not officially recognize Indonesia's sovereignty until December 27, 1949, after several years of struggle and diplomacy.

SAFE MICROWAVE USAGE AT THE WORKPLACE

Microwaves are a convenient solution for heating meals in the workplace, especially during busy workdays.

However, if not used properly, they can pose fire, burn, and electrical hazards. Let's ensure that every use is safe and responsible.

Why Microwave Safety Matters?

Though compact and easy to operate, microwaves involve heat, steam, and electricity — factors that require attention and care. Improper use can lead to accidents, damaged food containers, or even equipment failure. Safe practices help protect both people and property.

Microwave Safety Guidelines

Read and follow safety instructions

Always check the user manual and safety labels provided by the manufacturer.

Understand the microwave's features

Know how to adjust power levels, use timers correctly, and activate safety functions.

• Place on a stable, open surface

Ensure the microwave is on a flat, non-flammable, avoid tight or enclosed cabinets.

Use microwave-safe containers only

Avoid metal, aluminum foil, or plastic not labeled "microwave-safe." Use glass or ceramic when in doubt.

Vent food containers

Puncture or slightly open lids to allow steam to escape and avoid pressure buildup or splattering.

Set the right heating time

Overheating food can cause fires or damage the container. Always follow recommended times.

Microwave Safety Guidelines

Overheating food can cause fires or damage the container. Always follow recommended times.

Never operate the microwave when empty

Running it empty may damage internal components and cause overheating.

Stay nearby during use

Never leave the microwave unattended while it's running, especially when heating dense or oily foods.

Clean regularly

Food spills inside the microwave can lead to odors, smoke, or even fire. Wipe surfaces clean after every use.

· Do not use if the door is damaged

A loose, bent, or broken door can lead to radiation leakage or unsafe operation. Report any damage immediately.

Shared Responsibility in Pantry Areas

Using shared appliances means shared responsibility. Leave the microwave clean for the next user, dispose of food waste properly, and report any malfunctions to building management.

Heat Safely, Eat Happily

Microwaves make our work life more convenient, but only if used with care. Let's protect each other by making microwave safety part of our daily routine.
