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A Moment of Kindness and Togetherness

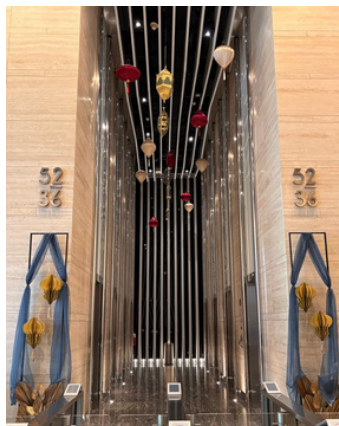

HSE BULLETIN APRIL 2026 : SLIPS, TRIPS AND FALLS PREVENTION

Slips, trips, and falls are among the most common workplace incidents – even in office buildings. They often happen due to simple and preventable conditions such as wet floors, cluttered walkways, or lack of awareness.

By paying attention to our surroundings and maintaining good housekeeping, we can significantly reduce these risks.

Common Risk Areas:

Be extra cautious in areas where slips and trips are more likely to occur:

- Pantry areas (water spills from sinks, drinks, or cleaning activities)
- Restrooms (wet or recently cleaned floors)
- Lobby and entrance areas, especially during rainy conditions
- Corridors with loose cables or improperly placed items
- Staircases and areas with uneven surfaces

Good Housekeeping Matters

A clean and organized environment plays a key role in preventing accidents:

- Keep walkways and corridors clear at all times
- Avoid placing items in high-traffic or emergency paths
- Store bags, boxes, and personal belongings properly
- Ensure cables and wires are secured and not left loose
- Simple Safety Habits
- Daily awareness and small actions can make a big difference:
- Watch where you walk and avoid distractions such as using your phone
- Wear appropriate footwear with good grip
- Report spills or wet floors immediately
- Be cautious on slippery or newly cleaned surfaces
- Use handrails when using stairs

By staying aware of our surroundings and maintaining good habits, we can prevent unnecessary incidents and keep our workplace safe for everyone.
