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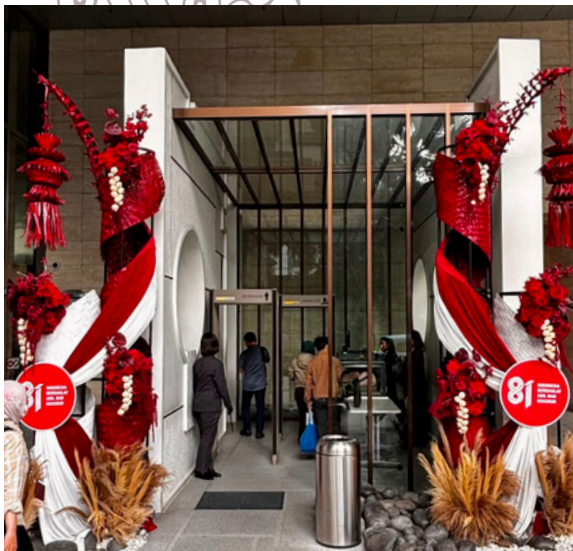
Capital Place in Red and White

INDEPENDENCE THROUGH PREPAREDNESS

Every August, we celebrate Indonesia's Independence Day—a reminder of the importance of responsibility, unity, and looking after one another. These same values also apply in the workplace, where safety depends on everyone's awareness and preparedness.

Although emergencies are rare, knowing how to respond before they happen can make a significant difference. Being familiar with evacuation procedures is not only part of workplace safety, but also an important step in protecting yourself and those around you.

Know Your Way Out

Take a few moments to familiarize yourself with your surroundings:

- Identify the nearest emergency exit from your work area.
- Learn the alternative evacuation route in case the primary exit is blocked.
- Know the location of your designated assembly point.
- Follow evacuation signage throughout the building.

Being familiar with these locations before an emergency helps reduce confusion and supports a faster, safer evacuation.

If You Hear the Fire Alarm

A fire alarm should always be treated seriously.

Remember to:

- Stay calm and stop your current activity.
- Leave the area immediately using the nearest emergency exit.
- Never use elevators during an evacuation.
- Walk quickly and orderly without pushing or running.
- Follow instructions from Security personnel or Fire Wardens.
- Proceed directly to the designated assembly point.

- Do not store personal belongings in evacuation routes.
- Report damaged exit signs, emergency lighting, or unsafe conditions.
- Encourage colleagues and visitors to follow building safety procedures.
